





I love the village community and the beautiful countryside. I also love how the people in Swalcliffe are always working to make things better in the village. I'm very proud of my part in creating the Swalcliffe Woodland Play Park.

Fun interesting fact?? I've sat in a jacuzzi with John Craven!

Strolling With Silas

Silas will share his experiences walking in the local area and occasionally venturing further afield. While many of the routes may be familiar, he will try to offer insights and interesting details along the way.

Tadmarton Circular Walk

Starting from Tadmarton, this scenic walk takes you along The Lea to Swalcliffe, then over Hill Farm to Park Wood and Park Lane. You'll follow the historic Roman Road before looping back to Tadmarton.

- Distance: Approximately 5.5 miles
- Time: 2.5 to 3 hours (allow extra time to fully enjoy the beautiful surroundings)
- Animals: Be prepared to encounter horses and/or cattle in some areas. Always
 exercise caution.
- Country code: stick to the designated footpaths, ensure all gates are securely closed keep dogs under control

Start your walk at St Nicholas church in Tadmarton. Head left, then quickly right down Stant Hill towards Swalcliffe Lea. Soon, you will see a kissing gate on the left. Pass through and follow the path down to The Swale stream and the two lakes. This area is rich in Roman history; a Roman well was found in the left-hand lake. As the footpath rises towards the road, note the field on the right. A Roman villa was discovered here and fully excavated in 2003. It was covered again so sadly nothing to see.

Turn left: on the road and follow it all the way left towards Swalcliffe. You will soon see the private Mill House on your right. There has been a mill here or nearby since 1279. It is believed that corn was still being milled until the 1950's and is now a private dwelling.

Tee Junction: Upon reaching the main road by the village hall, turn left at the tee junction. Then, promptly make a right turn, following the footpath sign located next to the end of the Barn Well Hill Railway, which is run by Swalcliffe residents Colin and Cathy. The railway is private however visits can be made by prior arrangement or on occasional open days. The next open day will be on Sunday 29 June. Access will be by ticket, which is free, and must be obtained in advance. Ticket applications and info from **BWHRevents@gmail.com**.

This path is uneven and descends steeply. Stay close to the fence on the right and cross the wooden footbridge that you will see ahead. Go through the gate on the other side and ascend the field diagonally to a farm gate. Through this gate go diagonally right towards another farm gate keeping the stables and buildings on your right. Do not be tempted to go between them.



Cross the yard directly ahead towards a mobile home and enter the gate next to it. This is a good place to pause and check to see if the first Swallows have made their long and perilous journey from Africa.


One more gate in the right hand corner of this field. Now directly ahead keeping the woods to your right to a final farm gate. Keep going straight up the path to the top of the hill and enter Park Woods on your right.

Park Wood in season will be covered in a carpet of bluebells. There will be a loud chorus of birdsong in here including Tits, Rooks, and woodpeckers. Silas uses an app called Merlin Bird ID and is always amazed the birds it can identify. Check out the Badger sets here too. The <u>well defined</u> path will eventually bring you out on the other side onto Park Lane.

Turn right: to follow Park Lane to the end. Note the thatched cottages on your left that date back to the 1700's. These cottages were part of the Manor Farm Estate, on land sold in 1379 to New College, Oxford, by the Swalcliffe Wykeham family. The entire New College estate was sold at auction in 1959.

Join the main road & turn Left Uphill and you will soon come across a concealed gate on your right. Go through the gate and descend towards Brakelands Farm. Follow the well-defined path straight ahead, crossing a private road to reach the footpath on the opposite side. Proceed over the crest of the hill, heading towards a metal gate. Shortly after passing through, the footpath turns right and crosses a stream, eventually joining the Roman Road. This area is known for its abundant deer.

Turn Right: Follow the Roman Road straight ahead to reconnect with the first part of your stroll. On the left of the Roman Road is a prominent round hill known as Madmarston Hill. Encircling the summit of this hill are the remains of the ditch and bank ramparts of an Iron-Age hill fort built by the Dobunni tribe probably around 400BCE. The ramparts sometimes show as cropmarks and springs often show on the slopes of the hill. The hillfort was abandoned after the Romans arrived but was reoccupied briefly and finally in the late C4th. Around the foot of the hill, particularly in the field to the South-West, was the site of the Iron-Age settlement whose round-houses sometimes show as cropmark circles in aerial photographs. With the arrival of the Romans the settlement evolved into an important Romano-British trading post with at least ten rectangular buildings and possibly two villas. Iron working seems to have been an important industry in the later 4th Century



A new Swalcliffe village Charity was formed back in 2024 with the purpose of supporting fundraising and volunteering in the village. Because it has a formal structure, processes, and insurance it can also better support volunteers and fundraising events.

So far, the Charity has focused efforts on updating all aspects of the village hall. This opens up new opportunities for the village hall to thrive into the future as we have also negotiated a new 125-year lease with Swalcliffe Parish Council.

The Charity intends now to focus its efforts on supporting wider community action. Over the next 12-months we will find ways to support village causes, help to coordinate and celebrate local volunteering efforts and look to secure new income streams. The latter includes exciting plans for local fundraising events, so watch this space for more details on those!

A founding commitment from the Charity was to operate in a transparent way and to be accountable to local people and the community. Consistent with this commitment, details of meetings, plans and policies can all be viewed on the website – along with how to donate, get involved or tell us what you think we should be supporting. A huge thank you to all those who have helped to get the Charity up and running. The Charity is especially grateful for the wider community enthusiasm and anticipated future goodwill.




