

Oxfordshire Wildlife Rescue

24-Hr Wildlife Helpline. 07549 322464

So 2 weeks ago we called out Oxfordshire Wildlife Rescue to help with an injured young buck. Rescuing Deer (Any Type) is tricky and the rate of success depends heavily on the skill of the capturer/handler and the equipment used. This is due to a condition called Capture Myopathy. The stress of being captured results in the body shutting down - think extreme shock, leading to the inevitable death of the deer. It can also present itself in the form of slow onset myopathy, so just when you think you got there, it all goes downhill.

But thanks to the amazing skill set and determination of the OWR staff- 2 weeks after capture- we were delighted to receive a video of the release of the fully recovered young buck.

OWR rescues all sorts of wildlife. You name it, they rescue it. They do not discriminate, recognising the damaging impact we as humans have on wildlife, creating casualties in our wake whilst striving for our personal welfare.

Often wildlife casualties are a result of our thoughtlessness rather than selfishness and with a bit more thought we can significantly reduce the negative impact we have on all wildlife.

- Take extra care (drive slower) on country lanes specifically at dawn and dusk a busy time for foxes, badger, hedgehogs, rabbits and deer.
- Think wildlife when turning your compost bin or having bonfires. Ideally shred and compost garden waste rather than burning it.
- Provide birds, rodents and insects with suitable nesting sites by allowing parts of your outdoor space to be undisturbed.
- 4) Avoid attracting "pests" so there is no need for inhumane trapping.
- 5) Keep cats in through the night or at least at dusk and dawn and adorn them with a Jesters bell to give birds, rodents and rabbits a better chance.
- 6) Dispose of your rubbish in carefully. Animals can easily get caught in wrap around plastics, netting, cut themselves on glass, sharp metals, screws and nails.
- 7) Avoid the use of pesticides and rodent poison.
- 8) Building? Think birds, bats and insects; they really can be part of the structure you create, enabling a thriving environment to the good of everyone.



As you can imagine training up staff/ volunteers, transport to and from the area of the injured animals, veterinary requirements, basic care like food, accommodation and rehabilitation come at great cost.

OWR are currently fundraising to purchase some land to call their own.







I might not have been able to fit you all in, in which case your article might be used in a later issue.



March 11th to 17th 2024 is Compost Week. The idea is to promote embracing sustainability, reducing waste and as a by-product saving money on shop bought compost and the emissions from the transportation/production of that. Maybe you have been composting for years, maybe you have a compost bin languishing in a corner that could be put to good use. You don't need a bin of course; a heap works perfectly well. Excellent advice is available on the RHS, BBC and Garden Organic websites. Give it a go!





Hot on the heels of Compost Week is Food Waste Action Awareness Week, 18^{th} – 24^{th} March. Love Food Hate Waste runs the annual campaign aimed at reducing the amount of food which is wasted in UK homes.

Currently, 60% of the food that is wasted in the UK is wasted by people in their own homes. That's 4.7 million tonnes of food being thrown away every year that could have been eaten. Figures vary but it's been estimated that the average family waste up to £700 of food every year. Love Food Hate Waste aims to educate and inspire people to keep food out of the bin and on their plates. Apparently 1.4 million bananas are wasted every day in the UK! This simple ice 'cream' is delicious. Peel them, cut into pieces and freeze. When frozen add a little lemon juice and some vanilla essence (both optional), blitz to make instant ice cream. Its so easy to put food in the food bin, when we could do more with it, help our bank balances and the planet.

Gardening and the risk of Legionella and other diseases

Below is an abstract from an article sent in by Helen Yeomans

"A dear friend of mine from Sibford was blue-lighted to the JR last August when she developed what the doctors initially thought was pneumonia. During her 30 days stay in intensive care, 10 days of which were in a coma, she was diagnosed with **Legionella Longbeachae**. The microbiologists at the JR finally managed to ascertain the cause of her illness was from peat-free Compost. My friend's recovery is slow and she is walking a little further each day, but even with physio it is going to take up to a year to get back to full fitness. I am so thankful that she is still with us and would not want anyone else to experience this disease due to not being aware of the risks"

The article sent in by Helen mentions L.Longbeachea and peat free compost, since this is what affected her friend.

I thought it would be a good opportunity to address the health risks associated with gardening. Helen has provided some really good ways how to minimise the risk (See Below).

*There are two types to which gardeners may be exposed: *L. longbeachae*, occurring in soil and compost, which can lead to a respiratory disease; and the more common *L. pneumonophila*, which leads to a type of pneumonia known as legionnaire's disease. The latter form occurs naturally at low levels in watercourses but can multiply in standing water to potentially harmful levels when the water temperature is between 20°C to 45°C. https://www.ecdc.europa.eu/sites/default/files/documents/legionnaires-disease-annual-epidemiological-report-2021.pdf

*Bioaerosols: these are airborne micro-organisms including spores, bacteria and fungi (e.g. Aspergillus fumigatus) that are naturally present in decomposing material. Gardeners are most likely to breathe these in when turning compost, especially in warm weather.

*Tetanus: the tetanus bacterium can enter through cuts or wounds. Since gardeners regularly handle thorny plants, soil or manure, they are at a higher risk of being infected than non-gardeners.

*Sepsis: although rare, sepsis can be triggered by an infection in any part of the body, following an injury in the garden such as a cut.

*Weil's disease (*Leptospirosis*): this is a disease humans can catch from rats through water or wet vegetation contaminated with rat urine. Rats also transmit salmonella.

*Plant hazards: as well as some plants being poisonous, there are also a number of plants whose sap or hairs can cause skin blistering, burns, rashes or breathing difficulties.

So please take these simple precautions when working in the garden

Wear gloves whenever handling soil and compost

Do not open bags of compost or potting media with your head right over it

Fold over the top of compost bags when not in use

Avoid potting-up in confined spaces

Moisten dry potting media before use. Also dampen down dry compost heaps before turning or use

Consider wearing a dust mask when turning compost heaps and handling potting media other dusty materials

Avoid storing potting media in greenhouses as these will heat up and may encourage Legionella.
