Despite the variable weather, we love the summer term here at Sibford Gower Endowed Primary School. The slight easing of restrictions has allowed us to re-start our after school football and netball clubs and children in KS2 and the children are starting to use the Big Field at lunchtimes as well as for P.E lessons and For-


est School. We are so fortunate to have such a wonderful space where the children can spread out as they play.


The children have been enjoying our thematic approach to learning. The younger children in Acorn and Beech classes are exploring the theme of The Enchanted Woodland and have spent some time exploring the trees in the Millennium Wood. They used rolls of paper to measure and compare the circumference of tree trunks and were encouraged to notice and describe the differences between trees, the shades and shapes of leaves, the texture of the bark, whether they are deciduous or "forevergreen" and so on. They made tree bark rubbings and have been learning the names of the different trees. There are so many changes and details in Nature for the children to notice, explore and learn about and our focus on outdoor learning develops our young learners in all sorts of positive ways. They show a real interest in, and care for, our natural environment.


Willow Class children, Years 3 & 4, are exploring the theme of Mighty Metals. As part of this, they have been exploring 'The Iron Man' by Ted Hughes as their 'class book' this half-term. This text is a rich resource for learning and the children have used it to develop their understanding of characterisation and enrich their vocabulary. It is also a very 'good read' and a story that we are sure the children will remember into adult-hood.

The children explored pencil technique in creating their own drawings of the Iron Man.



"To The Archives", for a change

This month we deviate slightly and instead of describing information already in the Archive and the fascinating stories that information brings to light, I want to talk about information recently contributed to the archive, some in response to previous "From the Archives" articles, and how this continues to improve our understanding of our history.

We have received a lovely collection of twelve documents including wills and leases for Holly Cottage in Bakers Lane, Swalcliffe, spanning 1742 to 1913. These add to the fascinating talk given to the Swalcliffe Society by Sue Moon some years ago and include some well-known village names such as Dix.

Another set of documents received relate to Langsat House, Swalcliffe, which began life as the stable and carriage house for the new Vicarage (now named Church House) built by the Reverend Edward Payne in 1839. These relate to the building of the Vicarage and Carriage House, the arrival of electricity in 1932 and mundane matters such as sewers and land holdings.

The discovery of parish Council minute books already in the archive has prompted the Parish Council to offer other minute books for digitisation and archiving and the Swalcliffe Archive is now providing a secure archive facility for the Council.

We recently made contact with Ian Henderson, son of Alice Henderson the first Matron of Swalcliffe Park School from 1954 when they both lived in the top floor of the big house. Ian is now a very successful artist living in Australia. His early artistic life included frequent paintings of local views and now, as a writer, his accounts of life in Swalcliffe and Banbury in the 1950s are utterly fascinating.

We have received sound recordings of BBC Radio Oxford interviews in 1988 with notable village residents Maurice Cooling, Brigadier Bamford, Helen Tustain, Judy King, Joan Robinson and Doug Seymour, and another sound recording in 1991 of Maurice Cooling and Joy Spiers talking about the early days of Swalcliffe Park School. A box of twelve VHS video tapes has also arrived containing Doug Seymour's capturing of village life in the 1990s and shows the Barn in near-derelict state.

Another interesting story recently elaborated concerns William Richard Wykeham, the last of the line to live at Swalcliffe Park, and his elopement, in 1789, with Elizabeth Marsh, who was a cook employed at the hunting lodge at Swalcliffe Grange owned by Mr Wrightson, Master of Warwickshire Hunt from c1780 to 1791. A gossipy letter from Mrs Wrightson to her sister tells of the hurried elopement of Mr Wykeham and the said cook to London for a hastily-arranged marriage, however the Tadmarton Parish Register lists their marriage in Tadmarton Church four months after the supposed elopement. Elizabeth may have begun as a cook but her offspring continued the Wykeham line and their daughter Sophia Elizabeth achieved greatness as Baroness Wenman of Thame and heiress to both the Wykeham and Wenman fortunes, another story that we must tell in detail in a future "From the Archives" article. written by: Colin Hill

For most of May Swalcliffe Barn has been the scene of a flurry of activity as Oxfordshire Museums Service and members of the Swalcliffe Society prepare it for a long-awaited reopening. It was not possible to reopen the barn at all in 2020 due to COVID lockdowns and restrictions on "indoor hospitality", but as the 2021 lockdowns are eased it is once again possible to allow visitors into the Barn and this will take place on Sunday 30th May.

The preparations for reopening included the usual activities prior to opening for a new season such as a dusting the historic vehicles, removal of cobwebs and bat guano and giving the whole interior a good spring clean. But this year we have had to install COVID screens around the reception desk, install hand sanitisers and implement a track and trace system and a one-way circulation system, all of which has meant much additional work. These precautions are mandated by Government COVID Regulations but, of course, provide safety and reassurance for volunteers and visitors alike.

The Barn opened as a museum for the first time in 1991 when the Duke of Gloucester performed the opening ceremony on the 10th September and we will be celebrating that 30th birthday this year. The opening followed a thorough restoration of the Barn preceded by the creation of the Oxford Buildings Trust in 1981 and their acquisition of Swalcliffe Barn in 1982 followed by the launch of a restoration scheme benefiting from substantial funding by English Heritage. We celebrate the 40th birthday of the Buildings Trust as well this year. The leasing of the Barn to Oxfordshire Museums Service enabled the creation of the museum we know today to house part of the Oxfordshire collection of agricultural and trade vehicles and enabling the Swalcliffe Society to create an exhibition tracing the history of our village over more than three thousand years.

Its opening in 1991 and every year since has been enabled by members of the Swalcliffe Society volunteering to open the barn every weekend throughout the summer months and hosting special visits for local societies, schools and, in fact, any group who are interested. The first year of opening was supported by a small team who were on duty several times that year, but soon our numbers swelled as more people from Swalcliffe and surrounding villages joined our team. The team increased to around 65 people by 2010 but in the last couple of years it has reduced significantly in size as people moved away from the village, or became unable or, sadly, though death. This reduction in our numbers has made it difficult this year to ensure volunteers are available for each opening, even though we are opening late in the season. We have managed to fill this year's schedule but next year, with a much longer season, it will be even more difficult to fill our schedule without numerous members doing multiple duties.

We therefore appeal and invite the residents of Swalcliffe, Tadmarton and other surrounding villages which once formed part of the originally very large Parish of Swalcliffe, to come and join our team and help us to ensure that Swalcliffe Barn can continue to be opened for the enjoyment of the public. Volunteering is not particularly onerous and involves opening the Barn for three hours on a Sunday afternoon and explaining to visitors, for example, why so large a barn is present in so small a village. This is usually a two-way process and we often learn as much from visitors as they learn from us.

If you are tempted and would like to know more why not pop into the barn one Sunday afternoon, or contact the Swalcliffe Society to find out more. You will be very welcome.







The Wildlife Page: MOLES

It is time we look at this amazing creature with the respect it deserves. Below I will try to explain why!

The European Mole is an Insectivore who loves living in healthy soil, the best part is that they help to maintain a healthy environment for your plants. A fact often overlooked.

We know they are around when we find a Molehill; a small mound of lovely fertile and beautifully aerated soil. With it's massively strong spade like claws it digs foraging tunnels – up to 200m long under the surface in which they will catch their prey.

Their tunnels connect a Nesting Burrow, Sleeping Chamber and Pantry. Their diet consists out of Earthworms, Insect larvae, Slugs, Cockchafers and Leatherjackets. They have to eat approx. 50% of their own bodyweight daily. With very limited sight they are relying on their sense of touch and smell with a nose that is as flexible as our fingers.

There is a short breeding season at the end of February and with a gestation period of about 4 weeks the female will produce 3-4 young at the beginning of Spring. Young will leave their home after approx. 6 weeks. This is the time when you are likely to see them overground, where they are most vulnerable looking for new territory.

Killing or trapping Moles is unlikely to sort out your problem because they happily take on someone else's territory and if you have done the killing, its an easy takeover for new Moles.

Yes they sometimes accidently dig up your lovingly planted plant, but you can put it back where it belongs being secure in the knowledge that the soil is of good quality, and if you smart you use the mound earth to repot you plant with. After all remember the nutritious value of this soil coming from 30cm below the surface. Leaving them be, they will only occasionally come above ground to collect grass cuttings etc to line the nesting burrow (in Spring), to find new territory (Early Summer) or to escape floods. They are excellent in providing drainage but of course during our new monsoon periods they don't stand a chance. Poisoning Moles is inhumane and cruel and removes a great natural pesticide from your garden. Using Mole deterrent actually deters Earthworms and you NEED those for a healthy garden. So the best this is to leave them and thank them for giving you some beautiful soil when planting for spring. Scoop up the mount and you have perfect fertiliser.
