



We shall keep the Faith

Oh! You who sleep in Flanders Fields, Sleep sweet-to rise anew! We caught the torch you threw And holding high, we keep the Faith With All who died.

We cherish, too, the poppy red
That grows on fields where valour led;
It seems to signal to the skies
That blood of heroes never dies,
But lends a lustre to the red
Of the flower that blooms above the dead
In Flanders Field.

And now the Torch and Poppy Red

The above poem by Moina Michael, can be thought of as maybe encapsulating beautifully how we might remember those who have lost their lives across the generations. We carry the torch of remembrance and with it our faith, so that we might not forget the ultimate price that many thousands upon thousands of people have paid, so that others might live in peace.

We are, however, today thankful for Moina Michael, for not only her poem encouraging us to remember and 'keep the Faith', but also it was she who had the inspirational idea in 1918, that the World needed a symbol or an emblem of remembrance. It was the Flanders field poppy that she dedicated her life to campaigning for government and voluntary agencies across the World, to adopt as a unifying emblem of remembrance. The simple poppy that we wear today, is as a direct result of Michael's 26 years of unwavering dedication and efforts to have the poppy recognised as the symbol of remembrance. She definitely in her life not only kept the Faith but also carried a torch to illuminate how we might remember.

We are today individually and together as a community and as a church family encouraged also by Jesus to 'keep the Faith'. So that no matter what we might be living through in our lives and as a community, we too might find the strength to continue to carry the torch that illuminates our Christian lives and journeys.

They grow not old, as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning we Will remember them.


COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

You've probably seen some people sitting by the side of your local road, with a clip board and a blue box on a tripod, and wondered what they were up to. They don't look like police - far too scruffy - and you didn't receive a fixed penalty notice. So who are they?



Four local villages share the Speedwatch equipment on a rotational basis, having paid for it out of your local village funds. The aim is to assist police teams with bringing offenders into line with our rural communities' wish for safer roads. Thames Valley Police are in the process of improving their system to align with other forces and combine with a national online system. More information can be found by searching online for Community Speedwatch UK and Thames Valley Community Speedwatch (CSW).

Back to Tadmarton. Your CSW team, under the auspices of the Parish Council, recently conducted a 2-week survey of traffic through our village. Please see the broad summary below. Of the 11,469 vehicles recorded by the equipment some 55% were within the 30 mph limit. The 45% that exceeded the limit comprised 29% travelling <35mph and $16\% \ge 35$ mph. The highest recorded speed was 58mph. 384 vehicles (3% of total) were recorded at ≥ 40 mph with 18 vehicles recorded at ≥ 50 mph.



The traffic flow averaged 139 vehicles/hour in one direction, which equates to approximately 280/hour in two directions or about 4 to 5 vehicles/minute. Monitoring hours were 0730-2250, with most of the sessions during daylight hours between 0930 and 1930.

Generally, within the majority of the village, traffic travelled at a resonable speed. As to be expected, nearer the edges of the 30mph zone, there were significantly more transgressions. Overall, the west (Swalcliffe) end of the village recorded a greater proportion of offenders and generally higher speeds. There was a significant number of vehicles exceeding 50mph; one vehicle was observed at 46mph whilst 3 Old Aged Pensioner pedestrians crossed the road to the bus stop. Nonetheless, the east (Broughton) end of the village recorded 20% of vehicles travelling ≥35mph and the highest recorded speed of 58mph.

Your Parish Council is liaising with the Police to improve speed enforcement and with the relevant agencies to see what other measures can be adopted to improve our road's safety. Please contact the Parish Council if you'd like to participate in a future round of traffic monitoring.







Your Wildlife Page: Saving our waterways from pollution.

Our waterways are one of the biggest assets, we as humans have to look, after if we want to survive.

After all:

Our body exists out of approximately 60% of water (Depending on Age, Body weight/ Fitness, Temperature and Hydration).

Our food can't grow without this precious resource.

Our natural world – Flora and Fauna- is wholly reliant on water.

Water in its natural form provides us with physical and mental exercise which is good for our health.

Then why is it, that we seem to be not taking as much care of it as we should? Are we not aware enough? The impact of polluted waterways is not visible to many of us, and out of sight out of mind.

I believe that we can all make a difference. Once awareness kicks in. We can make big changes through little changes with positive consequences.

So where do we start? We know that plastic waste ends up in the sea, we have seen the photos of Turtles with can holders around their mouths, whales with plastic in their stomachs, oil covered birds and dead fish. But what about our rivers and streams, lakes, ponds and wetlands?

We don't get to see much if anything about them, the only time we find out is if we participate in wild swimming, fishing, or a boating trip.

When we flick our cigarette butt into the street, or wash our car with soap, or empty our bucket used for cementing, down a storm drain or kill the weeds in our drive with pesticides, do we realise this is all a form of water pollution? What if we put our butts in the bin, used biodegradable soap to wash our cars, fill our bucket with newspaper to let it soak up the residue and dispose of this in the waste bin, use plain boiling water to kill the weeds.

What do we know about the way we dispose of our wastewater? We know of sewage treatment plants, we know that water companies should make sure that there is no spillage, but what about our own homes. Does your kitchen and bathroom waste go into the right drains? Does your cesspit get emptied in time? Are you careful about what you put down your drains?

We have seen photos of grease blockages, but do we understand the aftermath? Where there is a blockage, there will be an overspill - waste water will seep out and find its way down the storm drains ending up in our rivers.

Do we know what happens at sewage treatment plants, how effective can they clean the wastewater which is then discharged into our waterways?

Obviously Chemical plants and intensive farming cause a bit of a headache for water treatment plants, but did you know that:

Antibiotics, birth control tablets and other drugs end up in your urine. The successful removal of these is only 85%.

High Nitrate and Protein foods cause high levels of Nitrite in the body and ends up in the waste water. High Nitrite levels are seen to be carcinogenic.

Polypropylene Microbeads and liquid plastics despite its ban are still used in many beauty products including, firming creams, sunscreens, hairsprays, lipsticks, Mascara and foundation. All excluded due to the waterproof (nonwashable) loophole.

The water discharged into the environment containing the above substances can not only have a serious negative impact on the wildlife, it also finds its way back into our homes via the tap.




We are saying goodbye to two valued members of our school community. Miss Meadows has worked in our school office for nearly twelve years.
