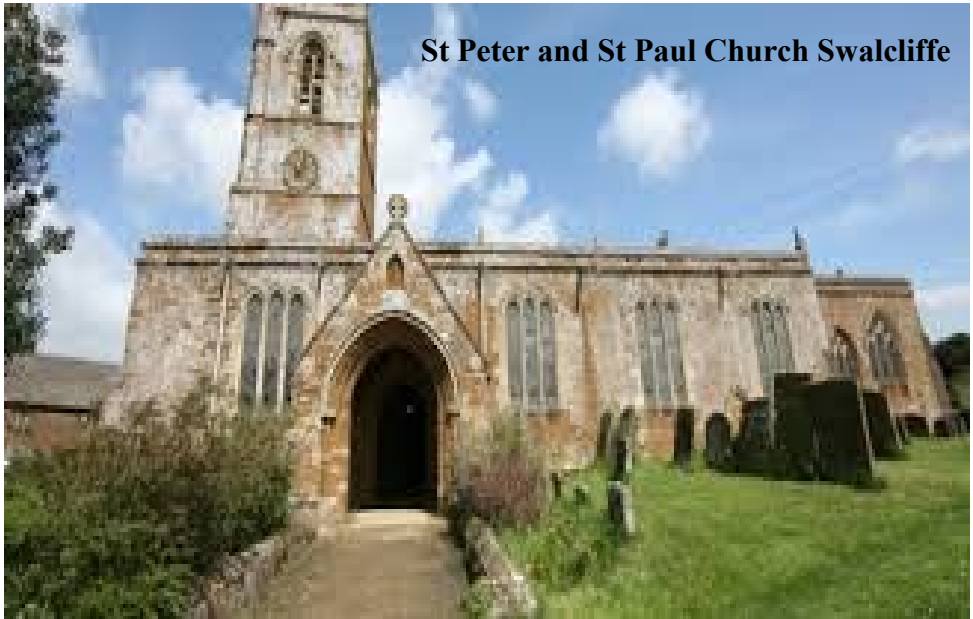

FROM the ARCHIVES

Swalcliffe Barn, like most small museums, has remained closed throughout this year, but as we plan for a reopening in 2021 a relevant piece of history has come to light in the Swalcliffe Archive.

In 1992 the barn had recently received a through renovation and had opened for the first time as a museum. The Banbury Guardian sent a reporter to find out about the museum and on 2nd July 1992 published an article shown in the clip on adjoining page. The article shows Sue Digby-Firth (in whose house we now live) flanked by John Morris and Jeff Demmar with the restored barn and collection of local historic vehicles in the background.

Having recently taken over the Swalcliffe Archive I have been rediscovering many items of local historical interest and we hope to make this a regular column in The Link. The Swalcliffe Archive arose from a course on Village History which took place in Banbury and Swalcliffe in 1977 and 1978 which was attended by a number of Swalcliffe residents. At that time Swalcliffe Barn was in private ownership and in much need of repair however a few more years passed before it was “rescued” and funds were found to restore it.

Meanwhile the local group continued their research, forming themselves into The Swalcliffe Society, and collecting a large amount of information about village residents, land use and history, so that by the time the barn was ready to be opened as a museum the Archive had gathered enough information to enable the creation of a substantial exhibition of local history which has occupied one end of Swalcliffe barn ever since.

The Swalcliffe Society has continued to support the opening of Swalcliffe barn each year by managing a team of dedicated volunteers who staff the barn on open days and the Archive has continued to collect new material with the aim of better understanding of local history. Some of the archive material can be seen in the Barn as exhibition displays and more is now on the Swalcliffe Digital Archive computer in the barn.

In recent years the Archive has slowly grown and we hope to make its content more available to the public in new ways including digitization and to ensure the more valuable items can be properly conserved. The snippet we present here is just a small example of the Archive content which spans three millennia of local history.

The Swalcliffe Society continues its work and is always welcoming of new members to help with archiving and operating Swalcliffe Barn on open days. However the collecting of information of local interest is largely dependent on local residents finding and offering it, so if you have or find anything of local interest, including but not limited to documents and photographs, the Society would love to see it and have an opportunity to copy and digitize it. 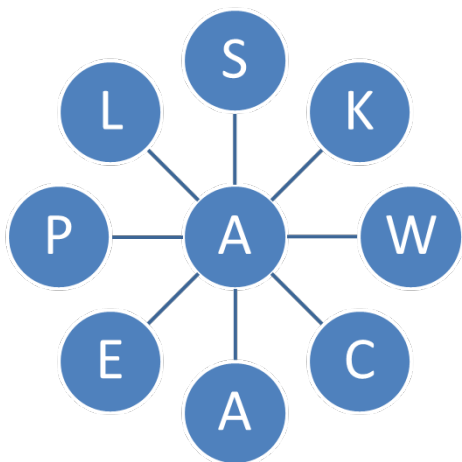

The Wildlife Page: This months Topic; Deer in the UK.

There are 6 different species of deer in the UK, only 2 of those are indigenous to the UK. These are the Roe and the Red Deer. 3 Are of Asiatic descend; The Sika and The Chinese Water deer and the Muntjac.

The Fallow Deer is believed to have been re-introduced by the Normans in the 11th century after becoming extinct with the fall of the Roman Empire.

Some deer are seen as threats to its environment, the main problem lies with them stripping and eating Crop plants, making them unpopular with some farmers. At the same time the negative economic impact is countered at some big estates by allowing deer to be stalked for a hefty fee (Trophy Hunting).

Apart from the Muntjac deer all other species are protected with a close season– a specific time in which it is illegal to hunt them. This is to avoid them being hunted during the breeding season. The close season varies for the different species. The muntjac is excluded since it breeds all year round.

Deer are susceptible to being hit by cars as a result of their dusk and dawn wandering habits. It is vitally important to get help if the animal is still alive since they are at risk to die of severe shock . Make sure you have a vet number handy when out driving. However If the animal has died it is good manners to move it of the road, if save to do so, for 4 reasons; it shows respect to the animal, it shows respect to other road users, it removes a potential dangerous situation and it stops carrions from getting killed whilst eating. Alternatively call 101 and report as a dangerous obstruction.

A young deer can be called a Calf, Kid or Fawn, the name is Species dependent. Their antlers when young are soft, vulnerable and easily damaged. The process of the Antlers hardening is called Calcification. The deer will rub their heads to remove old velvet , this is called Fraying.

Young deer are often left behind, snug up in some high grass or under hedges, whilst their mother is looking for food. It is important to realise this is normal and that touching the young can cause the mother to abandon the young (after all we are perceived hunters).

If a mother is worried about the threat to her young, she will flee trying to distract the threat away from her young. If you expect or know there are (young) deer around it is good practice to keep your dog on the lead.

After all if you are not out hunting, why would you want to upset wildlife.

If you find deer in your garden a nuisance, please give them my address, I would love to see them.

Serious please check with the British deer society to find out how to deter deer from your garden without causing them harm.

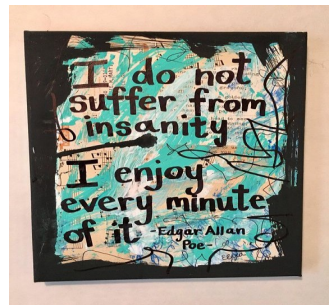
